SHIVERERS RULE THE WAVES
Shiverers Open Water Dominance Continues

Shiverers swimming clubs men and women's team win the Brighton pier-to-pier open water sea swim for the 2nd year running. This makes the Shiverers men's team the most successful in Sussex, winning the event more times than any other team.

Both teams included a 13 year old swimmer, Jack Boreham finishing 6th and Florence Margaroli 12th in their first open water event. Club captains Adam Warner 2nd and Charlotte Woolliscroft 1st lead the field. Woolliscroft recorded a finishing time that would have won the men's event.

Shiverers acting head coach Karen Woolliscroft was particularly impressed with Jack Boreham, commenting, "Jack could be an emerging open water swimmer..."

Adam Warner won the southeast region 5K open water championships the previous weekend held in Eastbourne. Finishing just a few seconds behind the 1st placed swimmer in the pier-to-pier was an excellent effort and a great example for team Shiverers.

At the other end of the country Shiverers swimmer Clare Fowlie (14 years) competed in the British Gas ASA National Youth Championships swimming the 50m freestyle in 28.03s.
